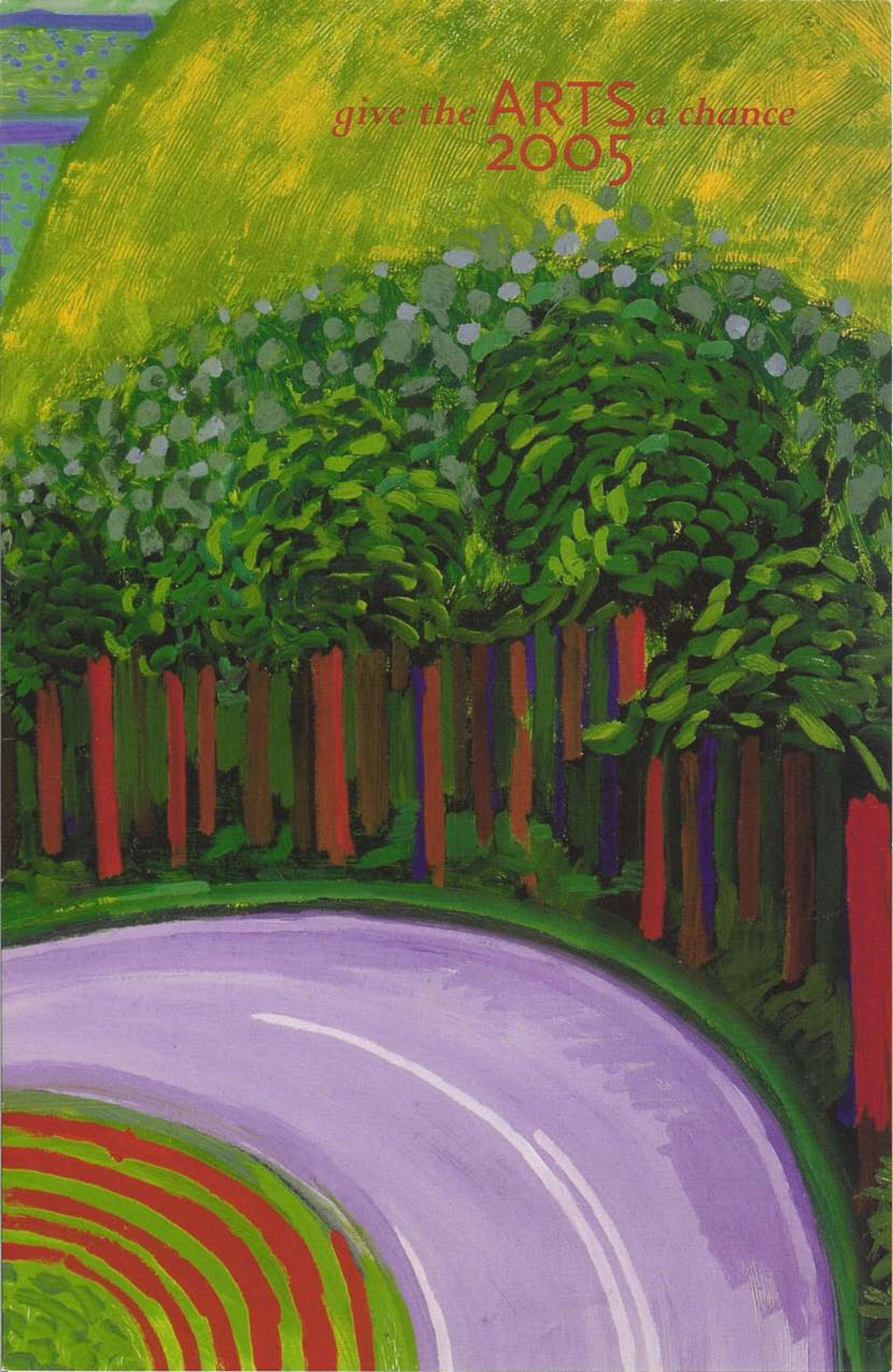
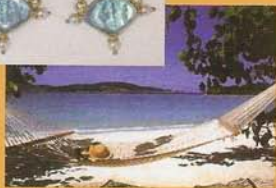

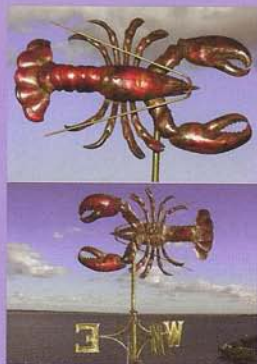
N TRUE BLUE BIJOUX

Fassett is also a featured speaker at Art in Bloom 2005 at the MFA. Described as one of the foremost experts on color in design, this illustrious former student of the School of the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston, has a loyal following in the international knitting, needlework, and quilting worlds. \$4,000



P BLOWING IN THE WIND

Master craftsman Anthony Holand brings together great design with Old World techniques. His Lobster Weathervane is a unique and functional work of art, meticulously built to last for generations. Made from copper and brass and measuring 27" x 32", this sculpture is created entirely by hand using the near lost art technique of copper repousse. Each distinctive Tuck and Holand weathervane is the result of many hours of handcrafting each piece down to the fine details, including a gleaming set of signature brass cardinal points. Their weathervanes turn in the wind in 45 states and 11 countries. \$7,000
